4. DOE/HQ Update - Antonio Ruiz

Antonio provided an update. The SNL workshop went well; we expect an update later in this meeting.

The ISO TC 197 and WHEC meetings are coming up. There are additional associated meetings of importance, including the IPHE codes and standards group. This meeting will be important to promote the harmonization of hydrogen codes and standards.
